

<p><b>Reading/ Phonics</b></p>	<p>If you have access to the internet, check out the Oxford Owl page. Your class log in is <b>classname20</b> (e.g. jade20) and the password is <b>books</b>.</p> <p>Can you recognise the Phase 3 sounds: <b>ai ee igh</b>? Can you spot them in books? Challenge: Use the Phonics Play website to play a Phase 3 game.</p>	<p>Read a few pages of your reading book. Can you tell your grown up what has happened so far and predict the ending?</p> <p>Can you read the Phase 3 tricky words: <b>she he we me be</b>?</p>	<p>Have a Reading Party with your toys. Share your favourite story with them. You could invite your brothers and sisters too!</p> <p>Can you recognise the Phase 3 sounds: <b>ai ee igh</b>? Can you spot them in books? Challenge: Use the Phonics Play website to play a Phase 3 game.</p>	<p>Read a few pages of your reading book. Can you tell your grown up what has happened so far and predict the ending?</p> <p>Can you read the Phase 3 tricky words: <b>she he we me be</b>?</p>	<p>Have a go at using one of our suggested websites or apps to play a reading game. Challenge: focus on the sounds <b>ai ee</b> and <b>igh</b> that you have been practising this week.</p> <p>Or you could play Tricky word snakes and ladders – this game is on our website.</p>
<p><b>Writing</b></p>	<p>Practise writing your name. Can you write your surname too?</p> <p>Pick a Picture, Write a Sentence Activity (resources on the school website). Choose one picture to write about.</p> <p>Don't forget '3 tick sentences'</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Capital letter to begin</li> <li>✓ Finger space between words</li> <li>✓ Full stop at the end of a sentence</li> </ul>	<p>Have a go at writing the Phase 3 tricky words <b>he, she</b> and <b>we</b>.</p> <p>Can you put them in a sentence?</p> <p>Don't forget to use your finger spaces!</p>	<p>Practise writing words with the sounds <b>ai</b> and <b>ee</b> and <b>igh</b>.</p> <p>e.g. rain, tail, paint, seed, sheep, light, night.</p> <p>Can you put them in a sentence?</p>	<p>Watch Wallace and Gromit's 'Cracking Contraptions' on youtube.</p>  <p><a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6g8WGpMstI">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6g8WGpMstI</a></p> <p>Choose your favourite to draw and write about or you could even design your own! Can you label it and write about what it does?</p>	<p>Write some instructions about how your contraption works.</p> <p>Encourage children to use a '3 tick sentence'</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Capital letter to begin</li> <li>✓ Finger space between words</li> <li>✓ Full stop at the end of a sentence</li> </ul> <p>You could take photos of your design and writing and email to your teacher.</p>

<p><b>Maths</b></p>	<p>Practise counting to 20. Can you count forwards? Can you count backwards?</p> <p>Challenge yourself to do 20 actions e.g clap 20 times; hop 20 times; do 20 star jumps etc.</p> <p>Can you say one more and one less than each number to 20?</p>	<p>Can you make an adding machine? (Here's what it could look like, but you choose how to make yours) Use objects to put down the tubes. Can you count how many objects altogether? (numbers within 20 to start with)</p>  <p>Challenge: can you write this as a number sentence?</p>  <p>Extra Challenge: Write a number sentence first then use your adding machine to check it's correct.</p>		<p>Can you play the addition board game (on the school website).</p> <p>Challenge: can you design your own addition board game and then teach someone how to play it.</p>	<p>Practise your number formation (the way we write numbers). This is how we write each number: 0 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9</p> <p>You could use: <a href="https://www.doorwayonline.org.uk/activities/letterformation/">https://www.doorwayonline.org.uk/activities/letterformation/</a> Just select the numbers!</p>
<p><b>Wider Curriculum</b></p> <p>Can you try something active everyday? Youtube: Joe Wicks, Cosmic kids yoga, Kidz Bop.</p> <p>What about trying 'Time to Move'. Glitter/lavender/ cinnamon/ something else?</p> <p>What models can you make from it?</p> <p>Perhaps you can take photos and use them to inspire your writing!</p>	<p>Can you experiment with ways of making music with objects from around your house and garden (with permission!)</p> <p>Perhaps your grown-ups even own some actual musical instruments that you could try.</p> <p>What can you find that is could for making a rhythm? I wonder if you can play them all loudly and quietly?</p> 	<p>You could watch a Wallace and Gromit Clip <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=jrmZlgVoQw4">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=jrmZlgVoQw4</a> and discuss how it was made.</p> <p>Then: watch a clip of animating a blob of clay <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PHTQrOkfA98">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PHTQrOkfA98</a>.</p> <p>Can you have a go at animating your own blob of clay/blue tack/dough – you could use your playdough from earlier in the week!</p>	<p>Can you make a collection of materials? Can you sort them into categories? e.g. plastic, metal, glass, cardboard, wood, rock (you may need more categories).</p>  <p>Which materials are shiny/dull; stiff/stretchy; soft/hard; light/heavy; rough/smooth?</p>	<p>Think of 3 things you would like to do when we are able to go wherever we want again. e.g "Have a sleepover at my gran's house." Write them on pieces of paper and put them in a jar to make an 'Activities Jar'.</p>  <p>You could keep adding to this every time you think of something you'd like to do but can't at the moment. When lockdown is over you will have a jar full of fun ideas to start fulfilling!</p>
